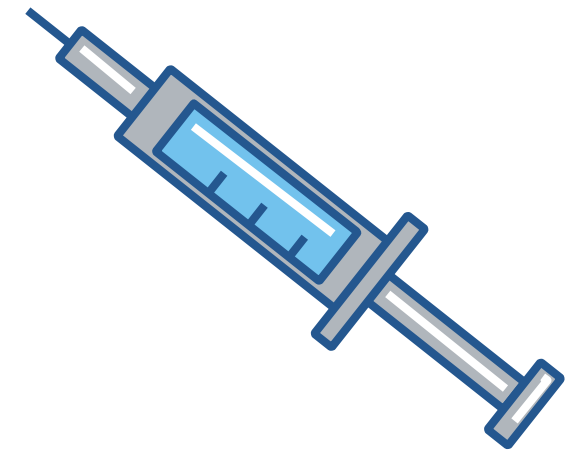


Skills required to be a pharmacist
